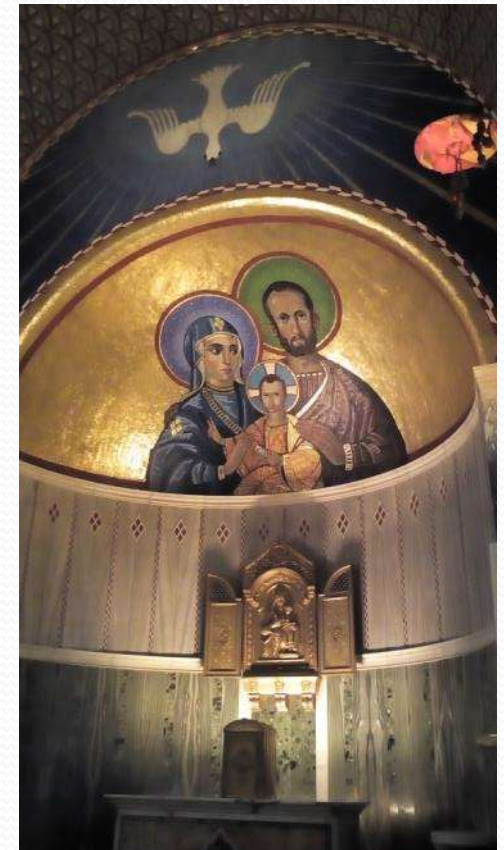

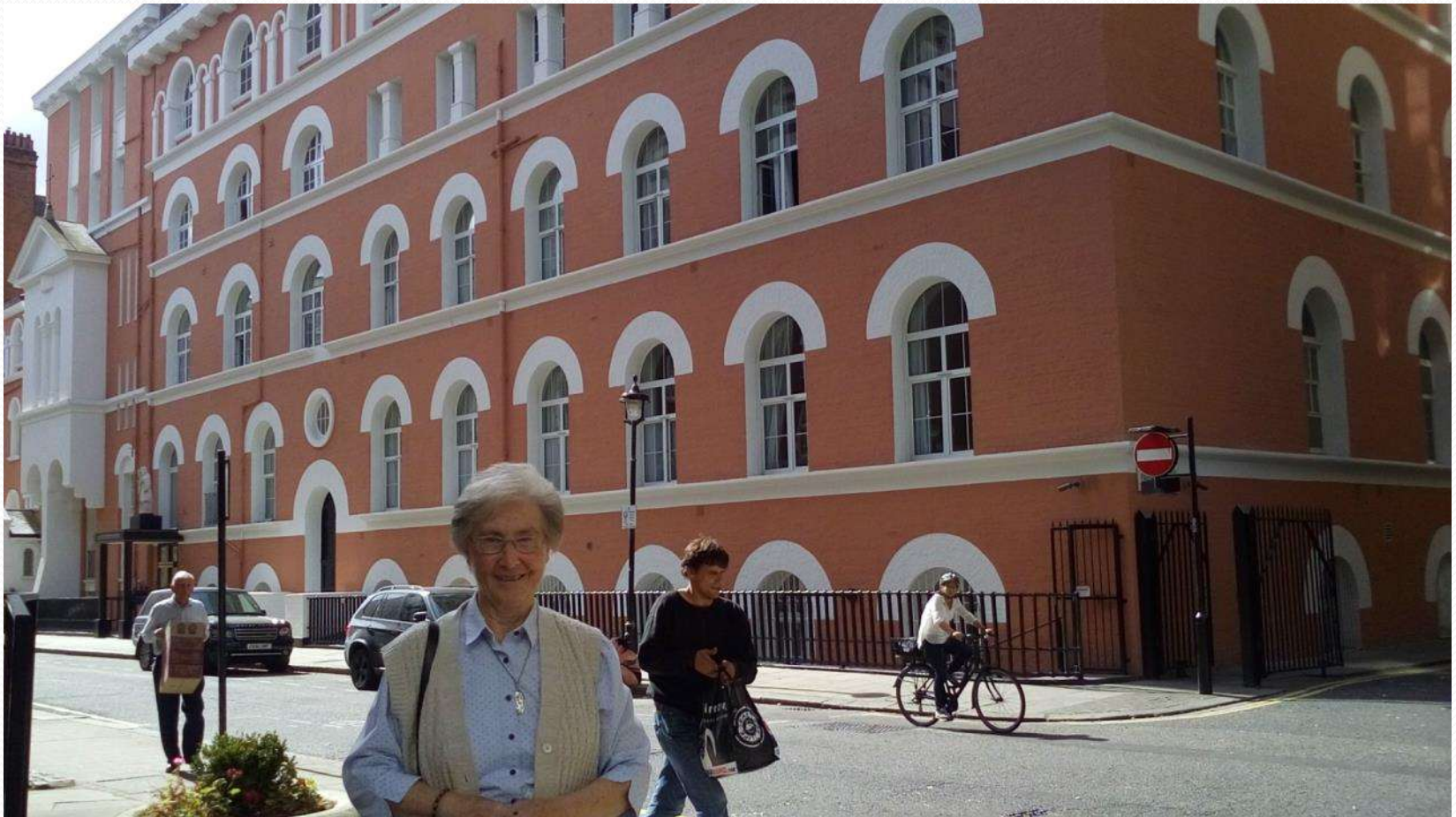

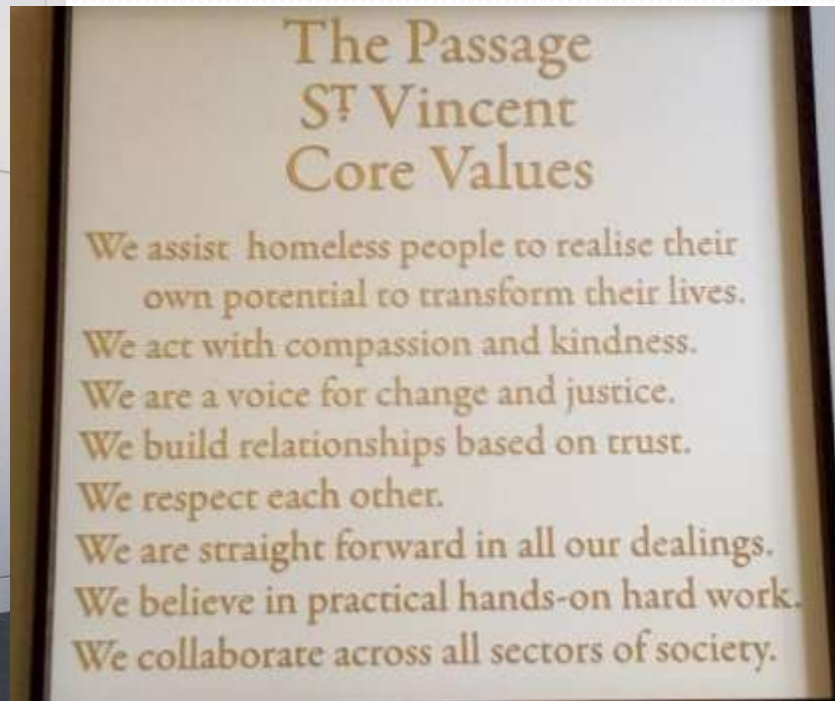


Visiting The Passage, a center for the homeless
